
Daily Devotionals





HABITS / WEEK 2 HIGH SCHOOL

DAY 1

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

GENESIS 1:1 NLT

What's your favorite part of God's creation? Maybe it's something like huge mountains or bright stars, or a new born baby or a massive forest. No matter what parts of creation put you in a state of awe, you get to see it every day. Wherever you live, God's creation is all around you. All we have to do is slow down long enough to pay attention and to see it. This week, make a point to look around and notice some of your favorite parts of God's creation.

DAY 2

Let the heavens be glad, and the earth rejoice! Let the sea and everything in it shout His praise!

PSALM 96:11 NLT

God wants all of His creation to worship Him—even the rocks and the seas! You might not be able to sing like an angel (even if you think you can) or play the guitar like a professional, but you can certainly worship better than a rock! Next time you have the opportunity to worship Jesus, do it with passion. You don't have to sing or have an instrument. Just use your words to tell God how grateful you are for the world He has made and the good things you are experiencing in life. God loves our worship no matter how we go about doing it.

DAY 3

By faith we understand that the entire universe was formed at God's command, that what we now see did not come from anything that can be seen.

HEBREWS 11:3 NLT

God formed the universe on purpose with purpose. He created each and every thing with detail—including you! Whether you believe it or not, or feel like it or not, you are a valuable part of God's creation. And that's something worth remembering! On a piece of paper or in a note in your phone, write down three things you love about the way God made you and who He created you to be. Then, stick that note on your mirror or set a reminder on your phone to be remind you of how wonderful He believes you are!

He counts the stars and He calls them all by name.

PSALM 147:4 NLT

DAY 4

For thousands of years, God's people have written about how much He cares for His creation. He cares about the stars so much that He calls them each by name. So, if God cares that much about the stars, how much more does He care for you—the one created in His very image? God knows every part of who you are. He knows your thoughts, your hurts, your dreams, and even your questions. Nothing you say or do surprises God or scares God away. Before your head hits the pillow tonight, thank God for how well He knows you and how much He cares about every part of who you are.

O Sovereign Lord! You made the heavens and earth by your strong hand and powerful arm. Nothing is too hard for you!

JEREMIAH 32:17 NLT

DAY 5

All of us have felt overwhelmed before. It's the feeling that we can't handle whatever we are facing, and it's a terrible feeling. The next time you feel like things are out of your control, remember this verse from Jeremiah. Nothing is too hard for God. It never has been. And it never will be. This week, when facing something big, remind yourself that nothing is too hard for God and thank Him that you can count on Him to be strong, even when you aren't.

Oh, how I love your law! I meditate on it all day long. Your commands are always with me and make me wiser than my enemies.
